Uniting Seniors in the City (formerly Trinity School for Seniors) is a mission outreach of the Uniting Church in the City (UCIC), and is committed to helping adults over the age of 60 to participate in life long learning, and to foster and enhance friendship and companionship on this journey. Uniting Seniors in the City functions as an inclusive community facility, providing education and mutual support to meet the physical, emotional, social, intellectual, pastoral, and spiritual needs of Seniors in the wider Perth community.

Uniting Seniors in the City (USIC) is grateful for the continued financial and administrative support provided by the Uniting Church in the City, without which, it would not be able to continue.

The school was started by the Trinity Church in 1979 and in 2024 celebrated 45 years of providing 'Companionship Through Learning' to the seniors of Perth. In 2026 Trinity School for Seniors transitions to the new name "Uniting Seniors in the City" and offers a thriving community of activity, providing over 80 courses for more than 400 attendees five days a week, and over four terms per year, with additional short programs available during the Summer and Winter school holidays.

We hope that you enjoy the classes and activities on offer during our 2026 Summer School program and we look forward to being a part of your life, just as much as you are a part of ours.

All money raised during Summer School is used to offset the running costs of our termly programs or to purchase much needed resources for our school community to use and enjoy.

Some classes may have an **additional fee**, payable to **Uniting Seniors in the City Reception** prior to attending. If you enrol in one of these classes, you'll receive a payment request. Please note that these additional fees are **non-refundable**, as materials or external services are arranged in advance.

Learn to Play Tunes on English Handbells

Come and try something a bit different and discover how to ring tunes on English handbells and handchimes.

Each person will ring two bells, one in each hand, but a ringer may choose to ring only one bell as part of our ringing team/choir if they prefer.

No musical knowledge is required – basics will be taught to ensure success.

Music notes are colour coded for each ringer / pair of notes to assist in playing well known tunes together as a team/choir.

Ringing is easier if standing, and a better sound and technique is achieved. However, handbell ringing can be done seated, so this class is suitable for everyone.

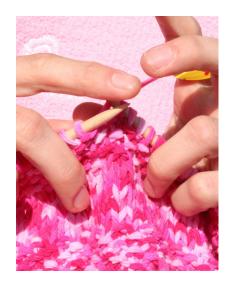

Vicarious Adventures in Europe, Pt 2: A Road trip through Norway with Rob and Rita Phillips

From July til September 2025, we travelled from the Netherlands to the very north-east of Norway in our motorhome. We drove 10,577kms over 63 days and spent 44 days north of the Arctic Circle. On the rare occasions when the weather was good, the scenery was absolutely fantastic.

As well as showing some of the beauty of this 'broccolini' land, we will tell you about some of our engagements with Norwegian people. We will share our observations of cultural elements of Norway, including the indigenous Sami people and Viking life; and political issues, including the relationship with Russia and the Norwegian sovereign wealth fund.

Stroke Foundation—Stroke Safe Talk with Eric Goddard

In Australia, a stroke occurs every 11 minutes. In 2023, more than 34,000 Australians, of all ages, experienced stroke for the first time... But the good news is that it doesn't need to be this way. More than 80 percent of strokes can be prevented.

StrokeSafe Speakers are trained in public speaking and experienced in delivering life-saving messages about stroke.

Many have either had a stroke themselves or are close to someone who has, so while they will present common information about stroke and its prevention, they will also draw on their own personal experiences so every talk is different – and very powerful.

Australian Army Museum of WA with Igor Iskra

The Museum is located at the Artillery Barracks, 6 Burt St Fremantle with the main building being built in 1910. While listed as an Army operational base, it is only used as a Museum. It is a major museum with galleries occupying most of the main two storey building and as well as some of the adjacent buildings along with displays around the site and parade ground. Additional galleries have opened since our last visit.

The tour will be conducted by Igor Iskra, a long time Museum Volunteer and TSFS student, with additional tour guides available if needed. The tour will start at the Queen's Building on Thursday 22 January at 09:00 with a train trip to Fremantle followed by a short, 1km bus trip along Victoria Ave to the Museum (with minimal walking). Parking is available on the parade ground to those wishing to travel direct to the Museum. This is available if the gate attendant is told that they are part of this booked tour. The site caters for disabled visitors. A tour usually takes about two hours but this depends on visitor interest level.

Cost is \$12 (non refundable) payable once your enrolment is confirmed.

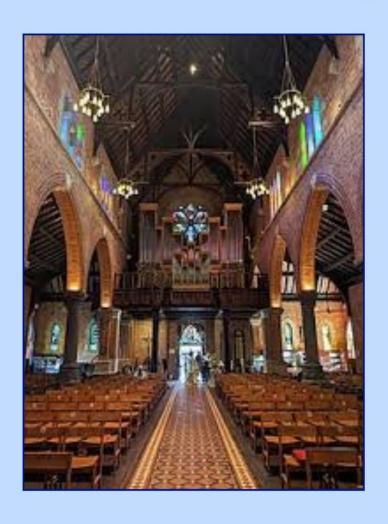

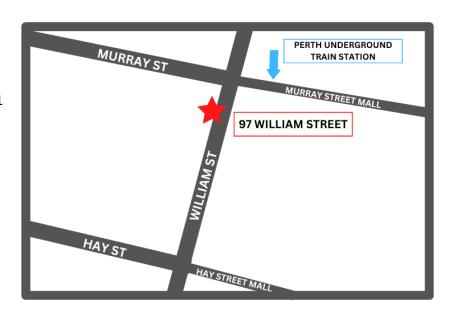

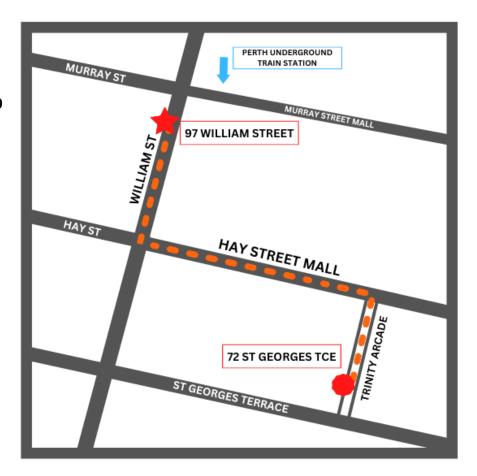
